## **ABOUT US**

The Oklahoma Poison Center is a vital public health service providing emergency management guidance for poison exposures, poison prevention education, and drug information to the residents of Oklahoma.

In 2023, the Oklahoma Poison Center received a total of 34,983 poison-related calls and placed another 33,137 follow-up calls to ensure patient safety and verify outcome.

The center is staffed 24 hours a day by specially trained and certified pharmacists and nurses, under the guidance of one board-certified clinical toxicologist and two board-certified medical toxicologists to manage the Poison Helpline 1-800-222-1222.


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

• Engages in training of pharmacy, medicine, nursing, and paramedic students as well as toxicology research. Serves as the toxicology training site for emergency medicine residents.



- Specialists are subject matter experts for the Oklahoma State Department of Health, law enforcement, and other local, state and national agencies in the event of suspected chemical, nuclear and bio-terrorism incidents.
- In 2023 the Oklahoma Poison Center received 260 calls that involved children aged 0-5 years exposed to marijuana in our state. 181 children (70%) of these were treated in a healthcare facility.

By managing 95% of human exposure cases at home, the Oklahoma Poison Center saved \$11.4 million in 2023, as the average emergency room visit in Oklahoma was estimated to cost at least \$1,000.

Data from a recently completed Oklahoma caller satisfaction and insurance survey indicated:

- If not for the Oklahoma Poison Center, 78% of callers would have self-referred to a healthcare facility and 58% would have likely gone to the emergency room.
- 50% of the people assisted by the Oklahoma Poison Center are uninsured or covered by government-sponsored healthcare programs.
